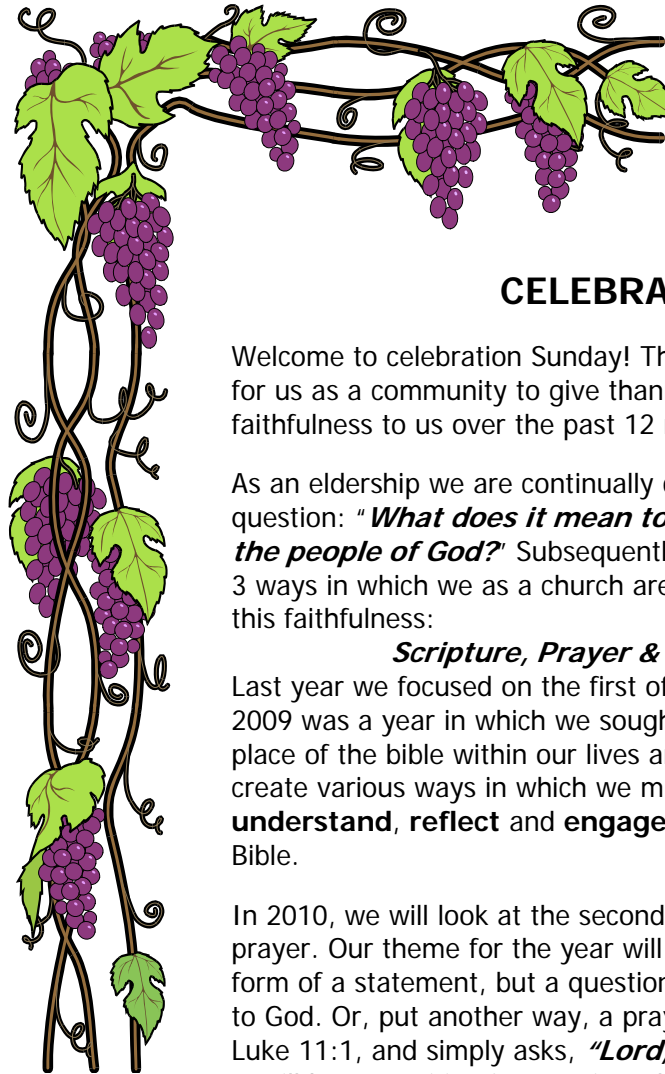

CELEBRATE

Welcome to celebration Sunday! This morning is a time for us as a community to give thanks to God for his faithfulness to us over the past 12 months.

As an eldership we are continually challenged by the question: "*What does it mean to live faithfully as the people of God?*" Subsequently, we have identified 3 ways in which we as a church are best able to express this faithfulness:

Scripture, Prayer & Worship.

Last year we focused on the first of these, Scripture. 2009 was a year in which we sought to understand the place of the bible within our lives and we endeavoured to create various ways in which we might better **understand, reflect and engage** with God through the Bible.

In 2010, we will look at the second of our priorities, prayer. Our theme for the year will not come to us in the form of a statement, but a question. A question directed to God. Or, put another way, a prayer. It comes from Luke 11:1, and simply asks, "*Lord, teach us to pray.*" It will be an exciting journey into the world of prayer. We will consider what the Bibles says about prayer, how Jesus himself prayed and how he might want us to pray. We will explore the different ways in which we might talk with God and discern ways in which we might take time to listen to Him and his rhythms in our life. "*Lord, teach us to pray,*" may it become our daily prayer in 2010!
